This year found twenty Division 7 Auxiliarists putting in 115 hours of volunteer time over the four days of the Boat Show held February 8-11 at the newly re-named Mt. We had the opportunity to expand our booth and added activities this year, which made it more fun for both the Auxiliarists and the 21,938 members of the public who attended this year's Boat Show. Who knew that tying knots would be such an attraction, and playing with toy wooden boats would be a fun activity for kids and adults alike.

We also had a special National Commodore's Achievement Award presented to Flotilla 113-07-02 for their outstanding contributions to the US Coast Guard Auxiliary for 60 years.

As Division Commander of Division 7 Utah, I would once again like to thank our members for the time and effort they put in during 2017 in promoting the Coast Guard's RBS mission and serving the people of Utah by promoting boating safety through everything they do. 3. The State of Utah lost a tireless advocate for our state parks system with the death of Fred Hayes, Director of Utah Division of Parks and Recreation, on March 2, 2018. Mr. Hayes was appointed Director in 2012 at a time when the legislature slashed Parks and Recreation's budget by 59%. Despite that, Director Hayes fought to keep all 44 Utah State Parks open, which has been a resounding success, as State Parks has had record park attendance, are profitable, and has created new recreational opportunities statewide. His passion shows in his motto: "having more people



having more fun in parks more often." We, the members of Division 7, feel we owe a debt of gratitude to Director Hayes for helping to make the lakes we patrol into the beautiful recreational destinations for Utah's citizens. His passion, excitement, and enthusiasm will be missed.
