2. Four members from Division 4 will attend and support the San Francisco Marine Flare Collection Event being held on Sunday 14th of April in San Francisco. We will be distributing Dockwalker kits, safe boating literature and promoting the activities of the Coast Guard Auxiliary.
3. This month we qualified 1 new Telecommunications Operator (Mike Brown, Flotilla 41) and 1 new VE (Gilbert Smith, Flotilla 49). We also have six other members working towards the TCO qualification.
