DETAILS:

- 1. Public Education:
 - A public education class on the use and operation of hand held marine band radios was held at Sports Basement in Sunnyvale for the Western Sea Kayakers. Twenty members of the club attended the event. Safe boating material, emergency radio call procedure decals and paddle craft reflector kits were distributed after the class.
 - A Dockwalker Class was sponsored by Flotilla 49 at the American Red cross in San Jose on 1st of May. The event was well attended by members of the public and Division 4 members.
- 2. Marine Safety:
 - Two facilities and crew assisted at the Sail Grand Prix event held in San Francisco during the 4th and 5th of May.
 - A new marine radio facility, owned by SO-CM Shawn Cooley has been officially accepted for use and issued with a call sign. The radio facility is located at Flotilla 46 tower located in the Port of Redwood City.
 - Several events have been organized as part of NSBW to be conducted at Lake Anderson, Alviso Marina County Park, Bass Pro San Jose and Redwood City harbor.

 - Randy Tan from Flotilla 46 qualified as a Program Visitor and accepted the position of SO-PV for Division 4.
