Vessel Examiners make Commercial Fishing Vessel Exams (CFVEs) The following CFVE activities were completed in March: Two CFVE were requested and referred to USCG CFVE Officer in Charge, Manny Ramirez based at CG Island, Alameda. Tom Stead qualified as a Marine Dealer Visitor (MDV) and completed 8 visits. Ray David mentored Stead to take the MDV test and accompanied him on the

required 5 training visits. Both Tom Stead and Ray David are on hold but ready to go when CFVEs are needed.

8,401 People Reached

Winter/Spring P.E. Classes in Santa Cruz began on Thursday January 8, 2020. Boating Skills and Seamanship (BS&S), Sailing Skills and Seamanship (SS&S), and Coastal Navigation (CN) classes were scheduled to continue until mid April. Flotilla 67 Members Bruce Krogstad and Marius Landauer have joined the Instructor team for the CN and SS&S classes.

In mid March, Auxiliary Instructors were directed to cancel all in-person PE classes. The remaining sessions of the FL 6-10 BS&S course were postponed until a later time.

The FL 67 SS&S Course and FL 67 Coastal Navigation course are continuing through mid April as on-line courses. The final examinations for those courses are being completed during the week of April 12th. Taking the courses on-line has involved making the course slide sets available to students on Google Drive, the publication of weekly Instructor's Commentaries to accompany the slide sets, weekly two-hour on-line classes utilizing the "Zoom" video conferencing platform, and interactive on-line computer chart plotting exercises using Open CPN, a free marine chart plotting program. For the Coastal Navigation course, a new final examination was created and is currently being administered at present. The students are assisting Coastal Navigation course Instructors in evaluating the examination so that it can be improved for future terms.
