### **DETAILS:**

- Flotilla Almaden's FC Jimmin Chang was awarded the Auxiliary Commendation Medal for his
  work for the period spanning NOV 2018 to OCT 2020. He effectively managed four national
  directorates and led the first service-wide gap analysis to get 100% of CG Operational
  Commands to cover resource gaps with Auxiliary assets, among other accomplishments.
