SAN FRANCISCO — Boat crewmembers from U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary operational facility *Silver Charm* met at Air Station San Francisco to participate in Helicopter Operational Safety Summit Team (HOSST) training on October 14, 2021. Flotilla 12 members Pete Gorenberg, Cassandra Mani and Tiffany Townsend were in attendance. Coast Guard MH-65 Dolphin helicopter pilot LCDR J.J. Briggs and flight mechanic Senior Chief Lorenzo instructed Auxiliarists on helicopter hoisting topics to ensure standard practice during training evolutions. Proper grounding techniques to control the discharge of static electricity were reviewed, including the proper use of helicopter hoisting equipment (trail lines, hoisting cables, baskets, litters, and slings). Device handling, hand signals, and emergency procedures were discussed during this interactive training session. Air Station San Francisco Commanding Officer Captain Thomas Cooper welcomed the Silver Charm crew and thanked them for their support of the helicopter operations training program. Captain Cooper is directly responsible for the leadership and operational performance of a 158-member, multi-mission Air Station protecting 650 miles of coastline, operating seven MH-65D helicopters ready for 24-hour launch at San Francisco and Naval Base Ventura in Point Mugu.
