DETAILS:

- 1. Members of Division 6 participated in the annual security patrol for the 26th annual Monte Foundation fireworks display held in Capitola Harbor on October 10th. Facilities that participated were the C.R.A.F.T. Moment, helmed by Walley Smith and crew, and Chuck Cobery's Mei Long. Dedicated to the children of Santa Cruz County, the Monte Foundation has been raising money for schools, sports fields, a family skate park and now the Capitola Library. The Monte Foundation's largest fundraiser is the annual fireworks show which brings in revenue to donate back into the community. The evening was a spectacular event, with a dozen or so boats in the harbor and thousands of locals observing along the beach and higher points of land. Additionally, the weather was perfect and the crews were able to experience some challenging night operations. The sponsors of the event later personally thanked the crew members of Division 6 for their involvement in maintaining a safe environment around the wharf, where the fireworks originated.
- 2. Flotilla 6-4 elected Karen Yoder as the new Flotilla Commander (FC) and Ben Fowler as Vice Flotilla Commander (VFC). Flotilla 6-10 elected Bruce Krogstad as FC and Mark Toledo as VFC. Flotilla 6-7 will hold elections on 16 November and are on track to elect John Fisher as FC and Sean Sheehan as the VFC in an uncontested election. Commodore Wally Smith graciously accepted the nomination and subsequent election as District Six Commander. His Vice will be David Frisbey, the former FC of flotilla 6-10.
