5. Planning 2022 training

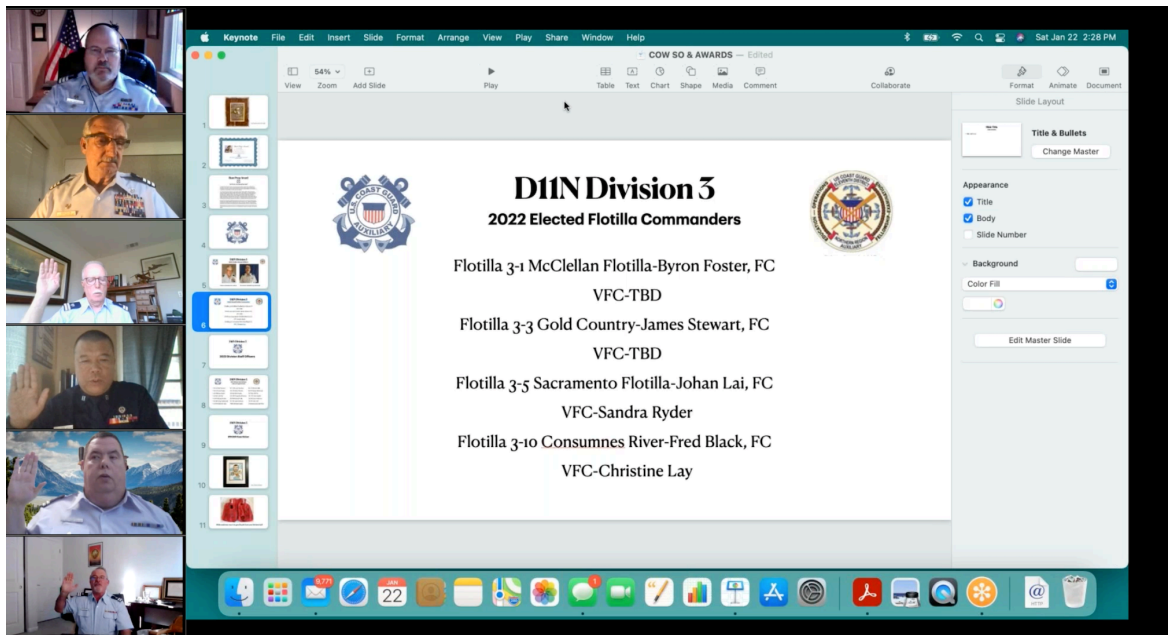
Agency Interaction:

2. Planning on assisting AIRSTA Sacramento with air drops, watch standing and safety training. FC Foster weekly works with Safety Officer correcting hazards.

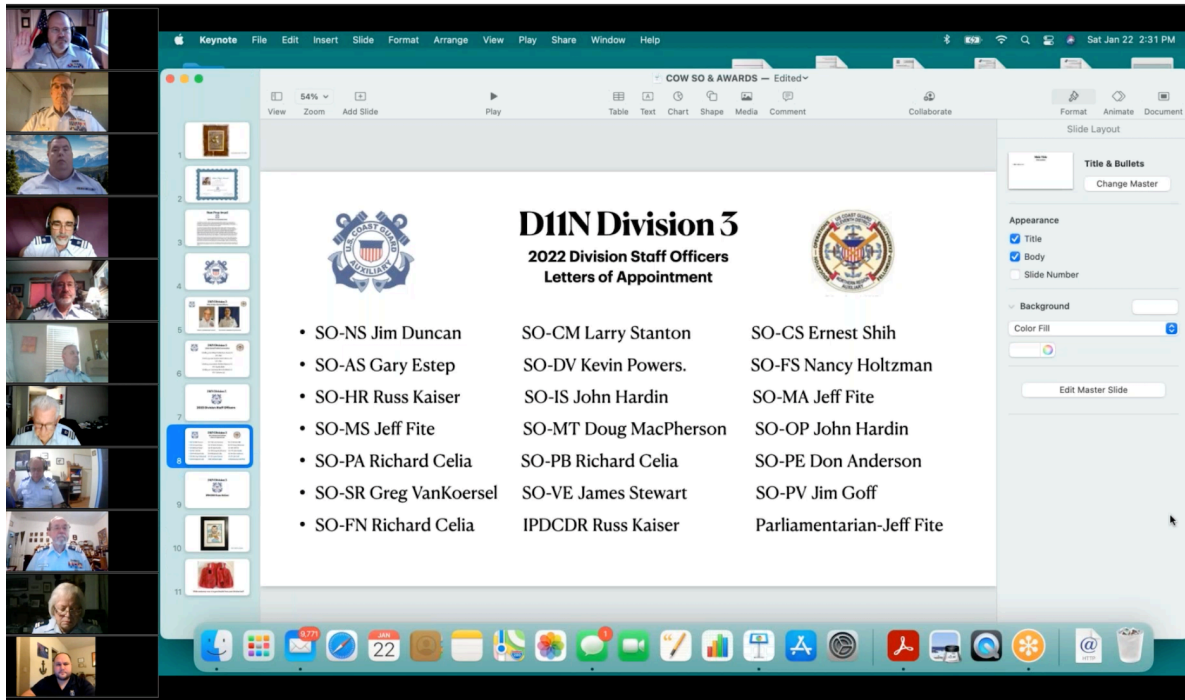
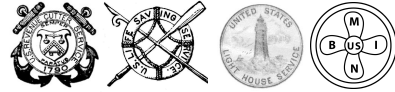
Goals and Objectives:
