July Report covering June activities

HIGHLIGHTS

- 1. Flotilla 6-10 is actively engaging with the Sea Scouts.
- 2. Helicopter Training Support missions Moss Landing

DETAILS

- 1. Members of Flotilla 6-10 Capitola have been actively working with the local Sea Scouts Ship. As a result, plans are underway to develop a training program both on and off the water. Auxiliarists interacting with the Scouts have completed the Boy Scouts of America (BSA) "Youth Protection Training" (YPT) that is required prior to engaging in any face-to-face and/or other contact e.g., email, phone, etc. More details are included in Flotilla 6-10's report below.
- 2. Helicopter Training Support for Air Station San Francisco was to have begun out of Moss Landing on Tracy Schultz's new facility DOLPHIN DREAMS. A monthly schedule has been worked out with Division 6 support on the first and third Mondays of every month; the first session was to be on 18 June however, very poor wind and sea forecasts precluded getting underway that day; in subsequent conversation with the C.O. of CG Station Monterey, the 47MLB supported the 'helo ops' that day and it was very rough on the boat and the crew ... and that was a 47MLB a.k.a. surf boat! The first Monday in July was the 4th so no training ... 18 July should see the first helo ops from Moss Landing with a crew comprised of Division 6 members many of whom have crewed for helo ops on SILVER CHARM.

Highlights

- 1. Three vacant FSO positions were filled in June- **Chuck Cobery** is now our FSO -PA, new member **Bryant Grigsby** qualified as a VE and accepted the FSO-VE position, and another new member, **Eva Jardin** is excited to assume her duties as FSO-PV. Our officer roster is not filled yet, but conversations are being held and future acceptances are anticipated.
- 2. June 7 Flotilla Meeting: Our in-person meetings continued with a quorum of 13 present. Eligible members present received their DHS-OUA ribbons. Chuck Cobery received a SOS ribbon for his participation in Fleet Week 2021 Operations. Guest Flotilla 6-4 member, ASOC Tracy Schultz, conducted a comprehensive presentation on our National DEI programs and progress towards achieving our diversity goals.
- 3. Public Education: The Spring BS&S semester concluded for 12 students. Awarded certificates of completion included four new 6-10 members. Fall semester registration is schedule for Sept 7.
- 4. AUXScout: Activity continued with the successful VE inspection of the SSS Pearls. **COMO Smith** is working with **Bryant Grigsby** in certifying her next as an OPFAC, which will be a welcome addition to our Santa Cruz Harbor based 6-10 flotilla.
- 5. Surface Patrol activity continued at a high level with 6 total patrols conducted, two were held jointly. Boat Crew training is on pace to likely qualify both 6-10 and 6-7 boat crew trainees at our Sept OPTREX.



Details

Our AUXScout activity will continue with future training planned to include a presentation on The Coast Guard Academy. Both Ground School and Sea School (at sea) training with the *Pearls* and our 2 facilities is also scheduled; certification of the SSS *Pearls* as a OPFAC is underway and will significantly increase our options for joint at-sea training.
