August Report covering July activities

HIGHLIGHTS

- 1. Flotilla 6-10 is actively engaging with the Sea Scouts.
- 2. Helicopter Training Support missions Moss Landing

DETAILS

- 1. Members of Flotilla 6-10 Capitola have been actively working with the local Sea Scouts Ship. As a result, plans are underway to develop a training program both on and off the water. Auxiliarists interacting with the Scouts have completed the Boy Scouts of America (BSA) "Youth Protection Training" (YPT) that is required prior to engaging in any face-to-face and/or other contact e.g., email, phone, etc. More details are included in Flotilla 6-10's report below.
- 2. Helicopter Training Support for Air Station San Francisco has begun out of Moss Landing on Tracy Schultz's new facility DOLPHIN DREAMS. A monthly schedule has been worked out with Division 6 support on the first and third Mondays of every month. The first Monday in July was the 4th so no training ... 18 July saw the first helo ops and it was very successful. Patrols are home ported in Moss Landing with a crew comprised of Division 6 members many of whom have crewed for helo ops on SILVER CHARM.

 Two new members were applauded for achieving BQ Ingelise Rowe and Debora Cohen. Four

 BS&S Course. Eva Jardin spoke regarding her new duties as FSO-PV and will soon be a
 Certified Program Visitor.
- 2. AUXScout- activity continued with the successful VE inspection of the SSS Pearls. **COMO**Smith is working with Bryant Grigsby in certifying her next as an OPFAC, which will be a welcome addition to our Santa Cruz based 6-10 flotilla.

As a result of a variety of complications, including darkness and heavy fog, they provided a much-needed escort back to the harbor for the *Pearls*.

Details

Our AUXScout activity will continue with future training planned to include a presentation on *The Coast Guard Academy* on August 3. Both Ground School and Sea School (at sea) training with auxiliary boat crew on the *Pearls* and Boat Crew training for Aux Sea Scouts onboard our facilities is calendared. Certification of the SSS *Pearls* as a OPFAC is underway and when complete will significantly increase our options patrols and at-sea SS training.
