HIGHLIGHTS

- 1. Continued surface operations
- 2. Conducted elections in October

DETAILS

- Helicopter Operations continued aboard the Dolphin Dreams. Three boat crew members from 6-10 and three from 6-4 conducted 2 joint Helo Ops in December. No other patrols were conducted due to limited funding.
- 2. All three Flotillas have re-elected their Flotilla Commanders.
- 3. The Division Change of Watch was held on 19 November at the Bayonet Blackhorse Golf Course Club House in Seaside, CA.
- 4. Members continue to volunteer at the SW Border as requested.
- 5. Santa Cruz Harbor Lighted Boat Parade 3 December 2022 13 Flotilla Members turned out on a cold and rainy night for this annual event in support of the SC Harbor. Members secured access to the gates to prevent too many people from overloading the docks. Weather did not keep the public away and there was a good turn out of lighted boat participants.
- 6. Public Education Fall Semester BS&S Classes concluded on 14 December with 9 students graduating.
