**HIGHLIGHTS:**

1. Auxiliary teaches boating safety class to Sea Scouts at Port of Redwood City
2. Division 4 CA1 cooking and keep morale high at Station Golden Gate.
3. Vessel Safety Checks despite challenging weather.
4. Mentoring of two new members.
5. Setting up immediate future projects.

**HIGHLIGHT DETAILS:**

1. Our SO-OP Paul Verveniotis taught Boat America's Boating Safety Class to 21 members of the sea scouts. They are from the Tradewinds (girls sea scout ship) and Gryphon (boys sea scout ship).
2. Our SO-CA Michele Gibson is more than capably filling in a billet at Station Golden Gate. One of the station's own Culinary Specialist has been ordered to C-School and Michele has stepped in to cook on several days including weekends to keep the crew fed and morale boosted. Michele has stayed overnight on several occasions for the purpose of getting up early to prepare breakfast for the crew.
3. On February 18, a VE from Flotilla 48 visited the boat ramp at Alviso and performed two vessel safety checks. On February 25 a windy and rainy Saturday two Flotilla 41 VEs performed 7 vessel safety checks in Suisun City. For the month of February, a total of 38 Vessel Safety Checks were performed.
4. One new member of Flotilla 43 was mentored to start ICS courses as well as CORE training. One other member was provided with a laptop and was shown how to obtain auxiliary passwords to get to CORE Training. (some members do not have computers and therefore need more assistance in completing required training)
5. Email sent to all Division Commanders to inform them of an upcoming boat show which will take place at the Port of Redwood City and invited to join Division 4 in staffing a boating safety booth as well as recruiting for the Auxiliary. First Aid and CPR training being planned for April.

The Coast Guard is required to ensure that its Auxiliarists are appropriately trained, tested, and found competent before being assigned to duty. The course selection is a minimum baseline of organizational familiarity and expectation supporting this goal. The value of this training has formed the core of every Auxiliarist's pledge and commitment to support the Coast Guard and abide by its governing policies.</p> <p>AUXCT contains a series of courses that members must take as a one-time requirement upon joining the Auxiliary or recertify once every five years.</p> <p><b>AUXCT Course Requirements:</b></p> <p>Repeatable Courses: To be completed by the end of the first full year of enrollment and then once every five years after that:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(1) Workforce Resilience Training (502379)</li> <li>(2) Security Fundamentals (810030)</li> <li>(3) Privacy at DHS: Protecting Personal Information (810015)</li> <li>(4) Sexual Harassment Prevention (810000)</li> <li>(5) Civil Rights Awareness (502319)</li> </ol> <p>One-time Courses: To be completed only once (new enrollees must complete them by the end of the first full year of enrollment):</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(6) Ethics 1 / Personal Gifts (502306).</li> </ol> <p>And the recently added:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(7) Basic Qualification Course II (BQC II).
