DETAILS:

A two-hour training and planning meeting was held April 27 with 28 leaders attending. We
focused on the current issues of attrition and the decline in available facilities in the
division. We also explored the reduced number of available crewmembers for the current
boating season. In addition, recruiting was a major topic because we need to recruit more
people who can train as coxswains and crewmembers for next year.

Attention was given to the need to use the division leadership, SO's over critical areas such as operations and training to improve member retention and socialization. We also discussed the need to support our PA events and make them recruiting opportunities. We had a PowerPoint presentation with a workbook which was distributed to all attendees.

2. The Utah Lake 4th grade field trip was conducted on four different days April 25 and 27 and May 2, and 4. This is an annual event where 14 teaching booth were set up to teach

everything from ecology and preservation to water safety. Flotillas 7-3 and 7-8 participated in the training events which included over 440 students from the local schools.

Since Utah has received over twice the normal snowfall this winter, the melting snow is causing rivers to run very fast and cold. The emphasis for training was water safety around swimming pools, rivers and lakes. In addition to the presentations, students were involved in on-hands activities with learning how to properly put on a life jacket, tossing a floatable device to our dummy Bob and playing the Q & A Coastie Safety Rules game.

Flotilla 7-3 is hosting PA events at Utah Lake May 20th and 22nd. We will be providing Paddleboard exams at the event from Lincoln Beach to American Fork Harbor. We also plan to have VE done during the weekend depending on members availability.
