As you can tell by the above D11N was extremely active over the 4th of July weekend with 83 separate missions. Submitted below by our members are a few interesting incidents that clearly show the versatility of our surface missions.

• The Delta:

On patrol 28JUN in Prospect Slough west of the Sacramento Deepwater Ship Channel, Bill Kinsey and his crew came upon a family of three people stranded on a section of broken levee in a blackberry and willow bramble.

Their boat had been holed on a submerged object at 2000hrs the previous evening on the west side of the levee segment, which is the flooded Liberty Island (38 deg 16.5' N x 121 deg 40' W approx). They spent the night on the levee. Their cell phone battery died before the collision took place, and they had no signaling devices and no VHF radio.

After assessing their condition and consulting with CGSTA Rio Vista, we transported the victims to the Rio Vista municipal launch ramp where their vehicle was parked.

• Lake Oroville:

Mike Maddox and his crew heard a call for assistance on VHF-FM Ch 16. The call came from a houseboat in the South Fork of the Feather River. They received information that one person onboard had suffered a severe laceration above the eye and needed medical assistance. The AUX vessel proceeded to that location. The bleeding had stopped by the time the AUX facility arrived but the victim and female friend were transported to the Bidwell Canyon launch ramp where he was released to EMT.

Later in the evening California Parks notified the AUX facility of a distressed vessel near the bank on the North side of the lake. The vessel was located and towed to the launch ramp.

• Division 7 USCGAUX, Responds to request for assistance.

A young man jumped into the water a mile west of Utah State Park Marina to recover equipment that had been dropped overboard. He did not resurface. The Utah State Parks contacted the Auxiliary for assistance in setting up a safety zone for the multi agency effort. High winds forced all the vessels off the water the first day but the recovery was made by law enforcement two days later.

• Lake Shasta:

Flotilla 39 crews on Lake Shasta assisted the Sheriff, the 4th and 5th of July, in clearing boat traffic for water bombers. Flotilla 39 had their hands full keeping boaters safe from aircraft picking up water to fight our Northern California fires. How would you like to look over your shoulder and see the below aircraft bearing down on you?
