10-5FresnoDouglas Lazo, FSO-PASee ReportOn September 19, 2018, the Central Valley Veterans group had celebrated the 29th Annual Veterans StandDown" at the Edison Social Hall at 3325 W. Clinton, Fresno, California. Commander Douglas Lazo andAuxiliarist Steve Pitts, was invited to participate at this event. The Coast Guard Auxiliary booth was utilizedwith various handouts, and the new California Boating Book and test for the boating card. Over a 100

books were distributed to veterans that owned boats or knew of people that had boats. "Coastie" was also present to be on patrol at this event. The coloring books regards to water safety was a hit with the veterans that had children. There was over 400+ veterans attending this event which included many vendors from

legal, food for homeless vets, free haircuts, and clothing for homeless vets. Many representatives from the City and State organizations were present to congratulate the veterans from World War II, Korean, Viet Nam, Iraqi, and Afghanistan conflicts. Guest speakers were Assemblyman Dr. Joaquin Arambula from District 31, and Cameron Porter - Chief of Public Affairs VA Hospital Fresno, California.

On September 22, 2018, the Clovis Veterans Memorial District had a National POW/MIA day honoring those who were POW'S and those men giving the ultimate sacrifice their lives and MISSING IN ACTION. Flotilla Commander Douglas Lazo, Flotilla 10-5 Fresno, California, marched in the Coast Guard Flag for the opening ceremony. Other comments were made by Vern Schmidt, commander of the Ex-Prisoners of War local chapter said "every person being honored gave the three S's-Service, Sacrifice and Survival. Jack Schwartz, who is 103 years old, was honored as the oldest living prisoner of war. He was captured in Guam three days after Pearl Harbor and spent 1,367 days imprisoned by Japanese soldiers. Captain Aaaron Raidt, of the Fresno Army Recruiting Company, spoke on honoring those who went missing in action. He said remains from World War II are being identified by DNA in 2018, including Marine Private Alva Jackson, who was on the USS Oklahoma in Pearl Harbor on Dec. 7, 1941. His family was in the audience for this event. Paul Loeffler, who organizes the "honor flights" in Fresno spoke on the courage the POWs showed as they struggled to survive. Over 500 people, veterans and families, were present at this event.

RANDY PARENT'S CELEBRATION OF LIFE: As I am sure you all know by now, Randy Parent crossed the bar on 14 August 2018. Randy was an active member of the Auxiliary for approximately 30 years and was a coxswain in his early years when he operated his boat in the Delta performing a variety of missions for the Coast Guard and Auxiliary. Later he traded in his boat for an airplane and became an Aircraft Commander. Randy was our District Flight Safety Officer (DFSO) and was well known and respected throughout the Auxiliary. There will be a celebration of his life on Sunday, 14 October 2018, starting at 1200 and ending about 1500; at Bud Field Aviation, 22005 Skywest Drive, Hayward 94541. This is a large hangar at Hayward Airport, just off Skywest Drive, with parking in front of the hangar. People do not need to go through any locked or controlled gates, but can walk in the front door of the hangar. There will be food, beer and wine served at his celebration.

Randy's wife, Traci, reminds us that Randy did like uniforms, e.g. military, Coast Guard and Coast Guard Auxiliary, airline crew, public safety, MVPA convoy; so, if anyone would like to wear a uniform they should feel free to do so. Otherwise, casual attire is always appropriate.

Reservations are not required, but if you plan on attending you can let me know so we can have an idea about the number of persons to expect.

TRAINING AND PERSONNEL: We still have three members waiting for their DO clearances. We have one new member who has started flight training and four others ready to start. We are pleased to have a woman helicopter owner/pilot who has submitted her paperwork to join the Santa Cruz Flotilla and we will be guiding her through the entry process. She is a professional pilot with over 20 year of experience and is rated in a variety of aircraft, including jets, sea planes, and helicopters. There are several other members working on their written exams and completing their DO forms.

AVIATION WORKSHOP & SWIM TEST: We will have our next Aviation Safety Workshop at Coast Guard Island on Saturday, 13 October 2018, starting at 0900 and ending in the afternoon. The swim test will follow the Workshop and will be at the pool on CGI. We are happy to accommodate auxiliarists who need a swim test for boat crew qualification. A medical screening certificate is needed in order to take the swim test.
