Topic Details:

1. OPTREX: Planning continues for our Joint OPTREX with Division 12 scheduled for June 21-22 at Richmond Marina, with 8 individuals requesting QE check rides, and many more requesting class offerings.

2. Risk Management Initial On-Line Class: We continue to encourage members who missed the April 30 deadline and now find themselves in REYR for non-compliance with the on-line RM 2.0 course to complete the process ASAP.

Risk Management Refresher (Due by June 2020): The second component of the new Risk Management program must be completed within 15 months of completing the original on-line class or June 2020, whichever comes first. This is a 4 hour in-class offering which will be available following the District Meeting on June 15th, 1300-1700Hrs at CGI. While completion of the 'refresher' is not due until next year, we are encouraging members to take the class as it becomes available.

3. Annual 1Hr OPs Workshop Deadline for all Qualified Crew, Coxswains and Crew Candidates: The 1 Hour Annual Operations workshop must be completed by June 30th to avoid going into REWK. The class can be given at any time by an approved IT with the power point presentation available off the District Website. A class is being offered by Flotilla 01-04, Wednesday evening, June 12th, 2000Hrs at Loch Lomond Yacht Club, San Rafael. Notification

of the class offering has been conveyed to all Division 1 members. The 1HR OPs workshop is in addition to the Risk Management courses for any qualified crew, coxswain or crew candidate.

4. Core Training Class renewal: I want to offer a big Bravo Zulu to FSO-MT Anna Harvey of Flotilla 01-02 and her IT team for coordinating a day long class covering the entire suite of Core Classes. The class was offered on May 5th at Station Golden Gate and was attended by members from all of Division 1's Flotillas, including those needing renewals and new members still in AP status.

5. Training Management Reports: We continue to encourage our Flotilla Leadership and FSO-MT's to run and circulate the Training Management report monthly so members can keep track of critical training deadlines and expiration dates.

6. Flotilla Staff Reports: (Synopsis)

a. Flotilla 01-02: FSO-OP Bob Golden reports that Crew Training is in process for new and re-qualifying crew members both on land and during training patrols aboard Facility Ranger. Facility Ranger and crew will also be participating in the Joint Division 1/12 OPTREX in June. FSO-MT Anna Harvey held a Core Training event on April 5th at Station Golden Gate. The event was attended by members of all four Division 1 Flotillas.

b. Flotilla 01-04: FSO-OP Steve Bustin has scheduled the inaugural patrol on the new facility "Seahorse 2" for June 8th. Additional patrols will be scheduled to accommodate crew and coxswain training. The Flotilla is offering the Annual 1HR OPs refresher course for all Crew, Coxswains and Crew Candidates following their June 12th meeting. DCO Mary Kirkwood will be instructing.

c. Flotilla 01-07: No Reports received

d. Flotilla 01-09: FSO-Terry Blanchard and Facility Silver Charm continue to provide old Side Helo Ops support, crew training and assistance with ATON/PATON checks. They are also starting the seasonal kite board patrols from Station Golden Gate. Between April 10 and May 5, Silver Charm has conducted 9 Patrols. FSO-MT Dale Fajardo continues to convey training needs, deadlines and class offerings to his members.

Goals & Objectives: To assure that all members seeking qualification, re-qualification or renewal training in any specialty area have access to the needed training, assuring a clear path to success.

Challenges & Needs: We continue to need additional Facilities to provide crew training and operational support.
