Chief Warrant Officer Dustin Finkelson, a native of Katy Texas, enlisted in the Coast Guard in 2004 and was first assigned to the USCGC KATMAI BAY in Sault Ste Marie, MI. In 2006, upon advancement to BM3, he was assigned to Station Panama City, Florida where he earned his qualification as a 41' UTB and 25' RBS Coxswain. Three years and two advancements later he had received orders to USCGC HERON in Sabine Pass, TX. While onboard he served as the Operations Petty Officer and Deck Watch Officer. In 2011 he was assigned to USCGC KODIAK ISLAND in Key West, FL where he again served as the Operations Petty Officer and Deck Watch Officer in Charge Certifications. In 2013 he received orders to Station Galveston, TX where he advanced to Chief and fleeted up to the Executive Petty Officer in 2014. In 2017 he received orders to Station Lake Tahoe to serve as the Officer in Charge. In 2019 he received orders to District 11 Auxiliary North to serve as the OTO.

Chief Warrant Officer Finkelson's personal awards include two Coast Guard Commendation Medal, The Coast Guard Achievement Medal, and The Commandant's Letter of Commendation. He also holds his permanent Cutterman, Coxswain, Advanced Boat Forces, and Officer in Charge Ashore insignias.

Chief Warrant Officer Finkelson is a graduate of the CPO Academy Class 202 and holds a U.S. Merchant Marine Officer's License endorsed to 100 gross tons with the towing endorsement. He is married to Morgan Finkelson and they have a little boy on the way due in August.
