Topic Details:

1. Unauthorized Use of PPE Gear-A Reminder to pass on to all Crew Members: Reports of an unidentified kayaker wearing a USCG Aux life jacket during a live SF Giants game has prompted our DSO-OP Bill Stolz to issue a reminder about the regulations pertaining to authorized use of PPE Gear. Please convey the following reminder to all your members with PPE Gear:

a. Chapter 10, Sec. A.9 of the Auxiliary Manual, COMDINST M16790.1 (Series): Auxiliarists may not wear any distinctive part of the uniform or official Auxiliary insignia with civilian clothing when not assigned to duty. This includes Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) that is marked with wording that includes, —USCG Auxiliary or any version thereof (e.g., life jackets, cold weather gear).

2. TCT vs. Risk Management Training-Further clarification: Confusion continues as we make the transition from our old GAR & TCT training to the new Risk Management program. The following is directly from our DSO-OP's Bill Stolz:

a. There seems to be some confusion with the terms or names TCT and Risk Management or even GAR 2.0. Most of the manuals including but not limited to the Auxiliary Boat Crew Qualification Guide's refer to the need to take TCT training. If you have taken the online or classroom version of RM100202 training and have or will be taking the 4-hour

refresher training, that fulfills the TCT requirement in the manuals. It will take some time for all the references to TCT to be removed and replaced with whatever term is decided on.

3. Crew Qualification Clinic: Virginia Luchetti (113-12 DCDR & Coxswain) has just rolled out a new Crew Qualification Clinic, developed with the input of our Coxswain and QE Corps. The program is intended to fast track the Crew Qualification process for those individuals willing to devote the needed time. The program overview and sign-up went live to our Bay area Divisions in August and interest is growing. Thank you to Virginia for the herculean effort in developing this new program.

4. Training Management Reports/Core Training Renewals: We continue to encourage our Flotilla Leadership and FSO-MT's to run and circulate the Training Management report monthly so members can keep track of critical training deadlines and expiration

dates. Focus should be given to any looming expiration dates for the various Core classes requiring 5-year renewals. If a 5-year renewal date is missed, the member will go into REYR for all Operational certifications and Leadership positions.

5. Flotilla Operations and Member Training Reports: (Synopsis)

a. Flotilla 01-02: FSO-OP Bob Golden: Ranger continues with on the water training opportunities.

b. Flotilla 01-04: FSO-OP Steve Bustin: Training continues for several members wishing to requalify or secure their initial Coxswain certification.

c. Flotilla 01-07: No reports received.

d. Flotilla 01-09: FSO-Terry Blanchard: Silver Charm is back in the water and performing patrols. We had the honor of having CMC Hooker, the Command Master Chief for Sector SF go out with the crew for helo work on August 28th. The air station asked to move our patrol from Wednesday, September 4th to Tuesday, September 3rd. Work has started to line up the Aux boat facilities for Fleet Week 2019 with the air show portion covering Thursday, October 10th through Sunday, October 13th. FSO-MT Dale Fajardo: Efforts continue to assure that the RM and Ops classes are posted correctly to AuxData.

Goals & Objectives: To assure that all members seeking qualification, re-qualification or renewal training in any specialty area have access to the needed training, assuring a clear path to success.

Challenges & Needs: We continue to need additional Facilities to provide crew training and operational support.

The California State Parks Division of Boating and Waterways (DBW's) and the California Coastal Commission's Boating Clean & Green Program, the Bay Foundation (DBW's Clean Vessel Act program) in partnership with the US Coast Guard Auxiliary, US Power Squadrons, and Save Our Shores, will conduct more Dockwalker trainings this year. (attached flier). If you are already a trained Dockwalker and were trained more than 3 years ago, please join us this year for a refresher class.

The USCG Auxiliary endorsed our program in 2000, since then you have been one of our main partners.

Attached please find the flier for our 2019 Northern CA trainings (2 pages). In the second page, and in the last frequently asked question you will find the benefits the Dockwalker program will provide to the US Coast Guard Auxiliary, including:

AUXCT Course Changes: The Coast Guard recently completed several changes to its inventory of core training courses for its workforce. These changes affect the composition of AUXCT. Specifically: a. The Building Resilience and Preventing Suicide in the Coast Guard course (502379) has been combined with the Sexual Assault Prevention/Response course (810045) into the new Workforce Resilience Training course (502379; NOTE – although carrying the same course code number, this is a new course that incorporates material from the now-defunct Sexual Assault Prevention/Response course). This new combined course is estimated to take about 30 minutes to complete, has a test-out feature, and retains its need to be completed once every five years. b. The Influenza Training course (502290) has been deleted as an AUXCT requirement.

3. AUXCT Course Requirements: As a result of these changes, AUXCT is now comprised of the following repeatable and one-time courses: a. Repeatable Courses: To be successfully completed by the end of the first full year of enrollment and then once every five years thereafter:

(1) Workforce Resilience Training (502379)* (2) Security Fundamentals (810030) (3) Privacy at DHS: Protecting Personal Information (810015) (4) Sexual Harassment Prevention (810000) (5) Civil Rights Awareness (502319)

· Auxiliarists who have yet to complete AUXCT because they had not completed the Sexual Assault Prevention / Response course (810045) must now complete the new Workforce Resilience Training course (502379). This holds true even if they already completed the Building Resilience and Preventing Suicide in the Coast Guard course

(502379) because the new version now contains material from the old Sexual Assault Prevention / Response course (810045). b. One-time Courses: To be successfully completed only once (new enrollees must complete them by the end of the first full year of enrollment):

(6) Ethics 1 / Personal Gifts (502306). And the recently added: (7) Basic Qualification Course II (BQ II)**

** This AUXCT requirement only applies to Auxiliarists enrolled after February 1, 2018.

RISK MANAGEMENT TRAINING REQUIREMENTS FOR THE COAST GUARD AUXILIARY

- (a) Risk Management, COMDTINST 3500.3A
- (b) Auxiliary Aviation Training Manual, COMDTINST M16798.5B (series)
- (c) Auxiliary Manual, COMDTINST M16790.1 (series)
- (d) Auxiliary Operations Policy Manual, COMDTINST M16798.3 (series)
- (e) Auxiliary Boat Crew Training Manual, COMDTINST
- (f) ALAUX 10/13 – Team Coordination Training (TCT)

TRAINING REQUIREMENTS. In collaboration with Auxiliary Leadership, the Offices of Safety and Environmental Health (CG-113), Boat Forces (CG-731) and Shore Forces (CG-741), the Office of Auxiliary & Boating Safety (CG-BSX) has established the following RM training requirements for members of the Auxiliary. The following are instituted immediately: a) RM/TCT Initial. The Introduction to Risk Management course (100202) is the initial RM/TCT requirement. This course is required for all elected positions and for select appointed positions and competencies listed in Enclosure (1). This course is available on AUXLMS. For those who may have difficulty accessing AUXLMS, the course can be taken in a classroom setting so long as the course is viewed in its entirety. (1) Elected Positions: The course must be completed prior to a nomination or notice of intent to run for any

elected position. (2) Appointed Positions: The course must be completed prior to starting an appointed position. (3) Competencies: The courses must be completed prior to becoming certified for a listed competency. In effect, these courses become required tasks for all listed competencies. (4) All affected incumbent elected/appointed personnel and anyone currently certified in a competency listed in Enclosure (1) must complete the Introduction to Risk Management course by 30 April 2019. b) TCT Refresher. This course is required for specified competencies listed in Enclosure (1). It must be completed as soon as possible after completion of the Introduction to Risk Management course and then annually, no later than the end of the 15th month following initial TCT or subsequent TCT Refresher training.

Auxiliarists needing a TCT Refresher session may work with their OIA, AUXLO, and/or DIRAUX/OTO to request TCT Refresher training using their district's process. Directors may grant waivers of TCT Refresher requirements if a lack of training availability will prevent a member from maintaining qualification. In such cases, the TCT Refresher must be completed as soon as possible.

California Boat Operators will be required to possess a Boater Card Date: January 1, 2019 California will start enforcement of Boater Cards for anyone operating a boat. This will start with anyone under 26 years of age.

Announcing the New CGAUX Leadership Competencies Training To Help Accelerate Your Career in the Auxiliary

Leadership Competencies are the knowledge, skills, and expertise the Coast Guard and Auxiliary expect of their leaders. The Competencies fall within four broad categories: Leading self, Leading others, Leading performance and change, and Leading the Coast Guard Auxiliary. There are 5 levels of knowledge (depth of understanding) that correspond to the Auxiliarist's level from Member to Flotilla Commander to Commodore including the corresponding appointed levels e.g. DSOs and Directors. Each level has an exam on the National Testing Center. Click "Leadership Competencies" in the column to the left for more explanation of the levels and the Leadership Competencies training material. Links to the NTC exams are included. This is not mandatory training but is strongly encouraged for members that wish to advance in both the elected and /or appointed chain of leadership. Having this training will be looked upon very favorably when it comes time to elect or appoint members to future leadership roles.

The Operational Specialty (AUXOP) course for Weather (AUXWEA) is available

The new course is a complete re-write of the (old) AUXWEA student study guide (SSG) and AUXWEA PowerPoint slides (PPT). There is also a new AUXWEA exam as part of the package. The new exam is NOT compatible with the old course material. There will be no hard-copy material or exams made available for this new course. Course material will be down-loadable from the AUXOP web portal but the exam must be taken on a computer with an authorized NTC proctor. You can find the AUXOP course material by clicking on "AUXOP Courses" in the column at the left.

The National Member Training Compendium is now available on MyCGAUX

A new Member Training Compendium has been posted to the website. The Compendium is a spreadsheet that gives links to all the material available for all Certification courses in the Auxiliary. This is the most comprehensive single source for training information in the Auxiliary. NACON Training slides are available for viewing and down loading

Each NACON conference has two days of member training with more than a dozen unique courses presented in Power Point slides. These courses could be excellent training in your DTRAINS or for Flotilla Training. Each course is taught in 1 hour. The NACON 2016 slides will be added to the course material from NACON 2013, NACON 2014, and NACON 2015 plus courses from NTRAIN 2013 in AUXCLASSROOM at this link: <http://classroom2.cgaux.org/moodle/course/index.php?categoryid=22> . Although you can see the link to the NACON presentations, you will have to log-in with your member ID and your password to have access to the material.

Auxiliary New Member Advancement Process

Beginning 01 February 2018, all newly enrolled members of the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary are required to complete the Basic Qualification II (BQCII) Course to move forward from Approval Pending (AP) status to any other Auxiliary membership status. Currently enrolled members, including those in AP status before 01 February 2018 are not required to take the course although it is highly recommended.

Upon completion of the seven BQII modules, both new and existing members will receive credit that is equivalent to completing the Administrative Procedures Course (APC) or the Flotilla Leadership Course (FLC) needed to advance in elected office and will be awarded one leadership credit toward their Auxiliary Operations (AUXOP) qualification.

Auxiliary members who are familiar with customs, traditions, and history of the Coast Guard Auxiliary, understand our missions and programs, the operational structure, the policies and regulations that guide us, and our protocols and uniform wear will be far better prepared to serve the Coast Guard than less knowledgeable members.

Mandated Training Methods and Certification Methods and Consequences of non-Compliance

Although Mandated Training (AUXMT/MANTR) has been available for years in one form or another, we now have a complete suite of training methods that should leave no Auxiliarist behind. This includes on-line through AUXLMS (not recommended due to complexities of browser requirements for each course), down-loadable PPTs (ideal for leading class rooms through the training), scripted PDFs, and down-loadable voice

over power point videos (due to file size, we recommend watching the videos on a computer screen). With the exception of AUXLMS, all the other methods require filling out a Self-Certification form which is then sent to your FSO-IS or SO-IS for AUXDATA credit. All this information is available by clicking on “Mandated Training” in the column to the left.

The C-School Website has been updated

The C-School web portal has been improved by removing old material and dead links. In addition, the C-School Matrix has been updated to better reflect the available C-School courses, contacts (POCs), and Comments/Eligibility so that it is clearer who is qualified to attend each course. The C-School schedule is posted shortly after we receive it from the Chief Director’s office. All the active courses available are shown in green. The C-School information is available by clicking “C-School Courses” in the column to the left.

Leadership C-Schools now have their own web portals

Go to the C-School webpage and see a matrix of all the C-School Auxiliary courses. Note that all the underlined Courses now have their own web portals. The newest additions are for AUX-02A & B AUXLAMs, AUX-05A AMLOC, and AUX-07 ASOC leadership courses. To access this information, click on “C-School Courses” in the column to the left.
