MS Missions

Ferry Boat Exam Status:

On Dec 11, ADSO MS Thomas Sarnicola, ADSO MS Michael Mitchell, DSO MS Wil Sumner met with Sector San Francisco Prevention CMDR Roberto Rivera and LCDR Frank Strom to go over the updated Ferry Boat Operations and Policy.procedures plus Training Aids and power point. Sector Prevention has agreed to endorse the program, and put on the Ferry Boat Training at the upcoming PCA Training Fair on January 18.2020. The Ferry Boat Training will offered only to existing Ferry Boat Examiners as Sector will be covering new procedures and describing the next 6 months trail period for the Ferry Boat Outreach Exams. Once Sector had completed their evaluation and sign off on the Commercial Ferry Boat Examiner PQS, they will allow the Auxiliary to open the process to qualify new candidates.

Commercial Fishing Vessel Examinations.

During November 5,6 & 7 Operation Crab Safe, 30 Active Duty, Coast Guard Reserves and Auxiliary visited the major fishing ports in Moss Landing, Santa Cruz, Half Moon Bay, San Francisco, Bodega Bay, Ft Bragg, Eureka and Crescent City and conducted 40 Commercial Fishing Vessel Examinations and 61 Safety Discussions. An additional 13 follow up exams were conducted at Bodega Bay during the weeks of Nov 12 & 20. Some trends seen in the exams show there are many new fishing boat captains with less experience and boats that had issues with life rafts and other safety gear. In spite of our efforts in both the safety exam plus safety discussions, a crab boat out of Ft Bragg went down on Saturday Nov 9 near Bodega Bay. One of 4 persons went missing wearing his PFD but not his survival suit. The life raft was not found. This boat was examined in 2018 so not due until 2020 for the next exam.

Dock Walker Results

Vivian Matuk, recently posted the winners of the 2019 Dock Walker Surveys, Number one was William Hale of Redding flotilla 39 with 532, Number 6 was Jim Golf Sacramento Flotilla 31 with 86.

Abandoned Derelict Vessel Activity

The Abandoned Derelict Vessel stakeholders meeting will be held on January 16 2020 in Hercules CA. We will be going over some new policies and procedures for the ADV surveys.

Marine Safety Training


