# Ferry Boat Exam Status:

Commander Rivera has approved the Ferry boat program materials and has allowed the trial period for Ferry Boat Outreach to start. Aux Michael Mitchell has prepared the No Cost Orders Paperwork which should go out shortly. Based on the COVID -19 standing orders issues, the exam hopefully should start in min April.

### Commercial Fishing Vessel and Uninspected Passenger Vessel Examinations.

While no CFVSE and UPV exams can be conducted at this time (we got two on March 8 and qualified one new CFVSE) this is a good time organize your outreach efforts for both groups. The recreational fishing season for bottom fishing is to start April 1 and Salmon Fishing on April 11, with commercial fishing on May 17 Operation Salmon Safe will most likely be delayed until mid May or until the operational hold is removed.

For UPV, a question is arisen on what CG AUX safety exam applies to Charter or 6 Pack Fishing Boats operating in Sole State Waters. These specific boats and operators have a State Charter Boat License and the boats have different safety requirements than recreational boats or UPV boats operating in navigable waters. DBW has provided their examination form for these operators that was shared with CG Sector SF.
