Getting Divisions active in putting on Marine Environmental Protection or Sea Partner programs

Michael Mitchell (ADSO MS UPV) is also an officer of the National Marine Safety Staff (Prevention),. Recently he was nominated and received the new position, Division Chief, Vessel Activities.

Wil Sumner (your truly) was also nominated and received am officer position on the National Marine Safety Staff (Prevention) as the PAC Area Branch Chief for Vessel Activities.

So Far in 2020, the Marine Safety Team has put in 589 hours in Marine Safety Training, This number already exceeds our Marine Safety Training numbers for 2019 (573). This is due to all of the SO-MS and FSO-MS officers that have taken the time to get the word out on the value of the MS Training and quality of the programs.

## **Division MS Report Highlights:**

All of the divisions are conducting great Marine Safety programs in their respective areas. Due to Cov-19 we are restricted in conducting many MS related activities. However we have been active in both the planning aspects as well as the training. Lets keep this up.

#### **DSO Activities**

With the success of the Introduction of UPV Examinations Class held in June, Michael Mtichell and I were asked to forward our training materials to the National Marine Safety Staff for review and adoption for the National Marine Safety training resources. We are in the second review stage of the acceptance process.

The Strategic Plan for the National Marine Safety Division includes adding new UPV and CFV Examiners to the Districts. Building the Introduction classes for these missions is the first step in accomplishing these goals.

#### **Sea Partners**

**Coastal Cleanup for September 2020**--Instead of having one, big-group coastal cleanup day, this year the 2020 Coastal Cleanup is happening *every Saturday in September*. For more information, and how people can participate, follow this link: https://www.coastal.ca.gov/publiced/ccd/ccd.html

For those members that are working on their MEES PQS, participating in the Coastal Cleanup program meets one of the requirements under section 5. We are exploring how as a civilian you could get credit when participating in this event(s) for this sign off. Will keep you informed.

## Commercial Fishing Vessel and Uninspected Passenger Vessel Examinations.

Sector approved "Virtual" Commercial and UPV Exams to be conducted by approved examiners in April. The most successful virtual exams have been done using Facetime or Goggle Duo. So far USCG Aux District 11 NR has completed 32 Commercial Fishing Vessel Exams and 13 UPV.. D11NR is the only Cg District that adopted the virtual exam process.

UPV operators can now take on passengers but must adhere to 6 feet of railing per passenger. This means that most "6" pack boats are really "4" pack boats.

## Marine Safety Training for 2020

In addition to the MEES, MSAM, HAZWOPER, SCAT and UPV classes provided so far in 2020, the next class bring constructed will be the Sea Partners Class. Currently Debbi Johnson, DSO MS in D11S has taught this class at NACON and is available to teach this class to D11 NR. We hope to offer this class in September.
