DSO Activities

DSO and ADSO MS UPV have completed the final edits and additions on the Introduction to UPV Safety Examinations training module. This training module was approved by Commodore Cady and forwarded to the CG Auxiliary Training Directorate to be included in the National Training Catalogue.

DSO and ADSO MS UPV have completed the first round of edits on the UPV PQS. The latest version has been submitted to National Prevention. Also we have been asked to edit the CFV PQS and this process has just started.

Commercial Fishing Vessel and Uninspected Passenger Vessel Examinations.

Well the Commercial Crab season got off to a rocky start with both rough weather, poor crab counts and pricing issues. Combined CFV exams for December were 33, with 27 for Sector and 6 for the Auxiliary.
