DETAILS

- 1. **Final Reminder** ... The 2022 Operations Workshop and TCT Refresher courses are NOT waived for 2022. The Ops Workshop is available on the RESPONSE Directorate page on the National website and must be presented by an Auxiliarist qualified in the boat crew program (Coxswain is recommended). The TCT Refresher must be presented by an authorized Auxiliary TCT Facilitator. TCT Refresher webinars will be offered online in the very near future. **Both Workshops are required to be completed by 30 June.** Several upcoming online presentations are listed on the 'District 11NR Calendar'; advance registration is required for the TCT Refresher. The Ops Workshop is open enrollment and will be presented on 20 June starting at 1900 PDT; here is the link: https://meet.goto.com/8843610

If a Division has not already done so, it is recommended to reserve a date on the District Calendar if you are planning to hold an OPTREX in 2022.

- 3. As we approach "OPTREX Season", please contact our Chief QE Coordinator COMO Angelo Perata at least 30 days in advance ... more advanced notice is preferable ... and let him know how many candidates are expected, the dates QEs will be needed, and the venue. This information will provide for adequate staffing of QEs. Also, please be sure that all candidates are fully vetted prior to an attempt to qualify; this is the responsibility of the Flotilla Commander.
- 4. Repeat Item: While we were hamstrung during the pandemic with severe surface operations restrictions, "miniOPTREXs" were a great way to get a few members certified or recertified in the boat crew program. At the Qualification Examiner (QE) meeting at D-TRAIN, this topic received a good amount of attention. It was agreed that miniOPTREXs would be approved only on a case-by-case basis and only for good cause e.g., a new facility owner needs coxswain qualification, or there is a crew shortage in a particular area and a couple of check rides are necessary to get facilities underway. Candidates should prepare and plan to qualify or requalify at organized OPTREXs and not rely on a miniOPTREX for qualification.

Mishap Reporting

From the Operations Policy Manual, Chapter 2 Section D: An individual or unit with first-hand knowledge of an accident or incident while assigned to duty must report all available information in accordance with district requirements. This report is normally made to the OIA, who then must pass the information to the appropriate Coast Guard commands and Auxiliary leadership. The Coast Guard will direct appropriate investigations as necessary.

As clearly stated in this year's required "Ops Workshop", all mishaps must be reported to Order Issuing Authority (O.I.A.) and the Chain of Leadership & Management (CoLM) "immediately". A mishap is defined "as any unplanned, unexpected or undesirable event that causes injury, occupational illness, death, material loss or damage. Additionally, the Auxiliary requires any incident which causes a disruption or alteration of the mission be reported".

We are aware of two mishaps involving a grounding and damaged lower unit / propeller that have occurred this year during "ordered" patrols; one was properly reported and the other was almost properly reported. As noted in this year's required Operations Workshop, the Coast Guard is applying "just culture" to mishap reporting, in other words, the purpose is to improve our safety and performance; not looking to punish. This is not a free pass for reckless or

dangerous operations. By logging all mishaps, common causes may be identified that may lead to improvements to policies and/or guidelines that will reduce the chances of similar mishaps occurring in the future.

Readying Candidates for Qualification

Last year a couple of Initial Crew candidates arrived at OPTREXs ready to complete their 'orals' and check rides with a QE. Upon review, the QEs found that their AUXILIARY BOAT CREW QUALIFICATION GUIDE, VOLUME I: CREW MEMBER book was not entirely complete with signoffs. This resulted in the candidate not getting an 'oral' or checkride. Flotilla Commanders are responsible for verifying, in advance, that candidates are have met all requirements prior to a qualification event. Please see the Pre-QE Requirements – 2022 document that is attached to the DSO-OP's email. Also, please remember that the BCM-08-02-AUX: Perform As A Crew Member During A Night Navigation And Piloting Exercise is no longer "waiverable".

Details

- 1. **Division 1 OPTREX Planning Update:** The OPTREX Registration form has been sent out to all Division 1 Members, plus all D11N SO-OPs and the DSO-OP. I am pleased to confirm that we have three OPFAC's committed to provide event support for the Div-1 OPTREX training day on July 9th and the QE Check ride day on July 16th:

As of this date we have 8 Crew Members registered for re-certification check rides on Saturday July 16^{th.} SO-CM Carol Paz has reserved the ACV (Auxiliary Communications Vehicle) to provide OPCOM for our OPFAC's and TCO/COMs training for both days. Registration for the COMs component of the event is included in the OPTREX Registration form (Attached).

2. NSBW Participation:

- **a.** Flotilla 113-01-04 held a large NSBW event at Station Golden Gate on Saturday May 21st, with more than three hundred members of the public attending. Among the many event elements, there were Active-Duty boat tours. This included dockside orientation and tours of two Division 1 OPFACs: COX Peter Shamray brought OPFACs SEAHORSE, and Cox Terry Blanchard brought OPFAC SILVER CHARM.
- b. On Sunday May 22nd, OPFAC SILVER CHARM made a tour of three local marinas, spending two hours each at the Coyote Point Marina, Oyster Point Marina, then back to her home port at Sierra Point Marina, Brisbane. Several members of the public came for a look at the vessel and to talk about the Auxiliary. VSCs and Boating Safety classes were also discussed with the public and sign-up sheets were provided.
- **3. On the Water Operations Activities Update:** Cox Terry Blanchard on OPFAC SILVER CHARM participated in several Helicopter Training patrols in support of Air Station San Francisco.

 - a. Line handling commands. If everyone on a crew uses the same terms, then the chance of a mishap is greatly diminished, and the patrol runs smoothly. Line handling is an integral part of being on and around vessels. It is in your best interest to learn and use the line handling terms outlined in this month's District Operations Report which is found here.
 - b. Practice the knots found in the Check Ride Qualification guide.
- 3. The District Operations report is an important way to get information on all things operations that are coming up in the District. Here is the link to the current and the past

reports. All the Division operations reports, including this one, are included with the District report so you can see what other Division are doing besides ours. Please read it, it is also attached.

- 4. We currently have one event on June 18th that the Parks have requested us to assist with barrier duty. If you have any event that get request, please let me know so we can coordinate support. We are working on having a mini OPTREX after the support of that event. More information to come.
