<u>ALWAYS WORTHY TO NOTE</u>: BZ to Manny Rimeriez: "Organized a Team Approach" to CFV's (Commercial Fishing Vessels): Manny with Michael Mitchell organized a Team of 24 – Certified CFVE's over a 4 Day Period. Covering Ports of Monterey, Moss Landing, Santa Cruz, Half Moon Bay, Bodega Bay, Fort Bragg, and the Humbolt Bay AOR: This Activity resulted in:

34 Dockside Exams, 24 CFVS Decals Issued, Two Safety Spot Checks along with 57 Safety Discussions with Fishing Vessel Operators. **BZ to ALL Involved in this Activity.**

BZ JEFF FITE: MAY/ JUN: Jeff , ADSO-MS MEES and MSAM along with his Division has Established a Very **POSITIVE RELATIONSHIP WITH THE CONSUMES RIVER STAFF Regarding** various aspects of MSEP including the Establishment of a permanent MSEP and RBS Booth, as well as Organizing a large Fall Shoreline Cleanup

I am certain from general communications, that the current ADSO-MS's and most SO-MS Officers are continuing to work towards seeing that 2022 is as successful a year for the MS Department in 2022 as it was in 2021.

I have continued to have Positive and Supportive communications with "COS" Curtis Han, D-Capt Bruce Martin, Jeff Fite ADSO-MS MEES/MSAM, Michael Mitchel ADSO-MS UPV (emphasis UPV)/ CV (and Manny Ramirez (Civ.) overseeing CFV at YBI: Sue Fry ASC, and as needed Past DSO MS Wil Sumner, and DSO-MT Ann Zoochi, along with ALL others noted within this MSEP report.

CDR Allegretti Chief of Prevention S. F. Sector Quaterly Meeting:

On 15 and 29 JUN I had meetings Noted in my MAY District Board and Staff Report, with LT Natasha Kenney on YBI. We have been meeting regarding proposals discussed during the 28 APR Quarterly meeting with CDR. Allegretti . CDR Allegretti requested that we meet more than once a year as previously with himself, and more frequently as may be needed with his staff Officers and the DSO-MS. Noting there was the opportunity for enhanced MSEP Auxiliary support of the Gold Side. I included packets for CDR Allegretti and his Staff Officers which included the Recently Received PAC-PARS NOI, the Updated MSEP Staffing of D11N and Ongoing DSO-MS Board and Staff Reports Indicating the MSEP Mission Activities.

Once Again, I have multiple times distributed to All DCDR's and SO-MS and cc'd CDR Allegretti and two of his staff Officer's on **CDR Allegretti's Request Regarding A Pending Community Support Event for the Town of Bodega Bay, due to the "CFV" Loss of Life incident.** This will be Scheduled with the completion of the Accident Investigation. This is Still Happening.

LT Kenney and I are working on, with her CDR's approval, the development of "Potential" Enhanced Training or Auxiliary Pollution Responders for IMD. We are developing a comprehensive "Updated" Specific to Sector San Francisco, Review of Polution Responder PQS Programs (Gold Side and Auxiliary) and Utilization Sector San Francisco "Qualified" Auxiliarist Support. Our Discussions include developing a Modified SCAT Training with Orals by Sector San Francisco.

We will meet later with LTJG Connell to be drafting plans for Auxiliarist **Cleared as "Eyes only" Crew members on USCG SF AOR Patrols AND more Assistance with Aids to Navigation.**

I informed CDR Allegretti that I Reported on his Interests of Expanded AUX Support, at the MAY, and All Future D11N USCG Auxiliary Board and Staff meetings. This being so I Provide current and accurate Information, as May be Needed, to the D11N Commodore. Chief of Staff and the D11N Board and Fellow Staff Officers.

At D-Train we offered successfully with Good attendance the following: <u>Introduction to</u> Marine Safety D11N and the HAZWHOPER AWARENESS (4 hr) Course.

MEES and MSAM INTRO PQS SAT 25 JUNE: was held At Station Rio Vista. This ALL Day MSEP Workshop was be welcomed by OIC Chief Bennett.
