4. ADSO-CM CC- Scholz:

There are several occurrences to report this month.

1. Following some discussions, the title of this ADSO-CM slot has been changed to ADSO-CM-I&CC which translates as "Incident and Contingency

Communications" to reflect the fact that the responsibility of the position is not just for contingency comms for the D11 Command Center but also as center of excellence for training and practice of the specialized comms tools and techniques that are used in an ICS environment.

- 2. In late January, a meeting of a planning team for comms issues in both D11N and D11 South was held and very recently a summary of the results of that meeting was released. As a consequence, it was agreed that there would be focus in several areas during 2023. They are: Carry out a series of three exercises of the D11CCNET; Arrange for the consistent use of the ACV as a training venue for HF operators on CG Island; Develop a better working relationship with the ASC's and AUC's for CG units to enhance the role of AUX communications; Carry out an ICS based table top exercise involving AD nits in all of CGD11 and involve the senior elected leadership form AUX both North and South; implement a formal training program for HF operators using the Westnet sessions.
- 3. A new description and organization of the "incident/contingency" portion of the Telecommunications pages of the D11N AUX website has been created and the text and some materials have been submitted to the DSO-CS for implementation. This part of the D11N website will become the location where training, policy, procedures, and TTP docs for D11N and D11S joint activities will be published.
- 5. 4. As of the middle of February, I was re-appointed as the Manager of the West Coast Region HF Net which is responsible for contingency comms operations in Districts 11, 13, 14, 17, and the Coastal Region of District 8.

# **Activity Details**

- \* CG Station Rio Vista conducted only **01 SAR case** during the last 30 days. The average February SARs over the last 10 years is 06. The most SARs conducted by the Station in one day was 13 on a Sunday in July 2009. The Station conducted **15 Vessel Boardings**. The average February boardings for the last 10 years is 25. The most boardings conducted in one month by the Station was 149 in September 2015. Low activity mostly due to weather and very poor fishing.
- \* Morgan Curtis VFC 5-3 stood 12 hours of Radio Watchstanding (20B) over 03 days.
- \* I stood only 09 days of **Radio Watchstanding (20B)** at the Station for a total of 61 hours. Low activity due to spouse medical issues.

\*The Station's monthly **DOIT** (**Delta Officers Intelligence Team**) meeting has been changed to quarterly. Station leadership met on the 8<sup>th</sup> to develop a plan of action.
