








V PAC AREA Statistics



The NEW D11NR VSC goal for 2023 is 3,000 VSC's. Currently we are 139% of 2022 and have 21% of the PAC AREA VSC total. The data source is AUXDATA2*. Additional stats from AUXDATA2* indicates that 1693 or 81% have passed the VSC, 1220 or 59% are First Time VSC's, and 951 or 46% are High Focus VSC's. In addition 618 Paddlecraft VSC's have been performed, which is approximately 30% of our total VSC production. We currently have 106 ACTIVE Vessel Examiners (VE's) which averages 19 VSC's per examiner. National average is 20 VSC's per examiner. *Current Year statistics shown in AUXDATA2 thru August 31, 2023

VSC Questions

- -These are actual questions from VE Exam Version "F" dated 2014. Answers can be found in another location in the report
 - 1. Operational Facilities (other than PWC facilities) must own and maintain:
 - a. An inflatable lifeboat.
 - b. Navigation Rules publications, COMDTINST M16672.2.
 - c. A full radar suite.
 - d. A Quick Reference Navigation Rules card.
 - 2. When checking a 27' stern drive boat, the owner cannot produce the pole for the combined stern and masthead light. Is the boat eligible for the VSC decal?
 - No, it doesn't matter where the pole is, that lighting configuration isn't legal on a boat longer than 26'.
 - b. Yes, if the owner advises you that the boat only gets underway during daylight.
 - c. No, even though it is daylight, the VE must ensure that the boat is able to display the proper navigation lights.
 - d. Yes, but the owner needs to promise the VE that the pole will always be onboard in the future.

-VSC's ON RENTALS-At the request of Commodore Kirkwood, and after 18-years, the VSC Rental Program was updated in 2019 and moving forward. <u>ANYONE</u> who performs rental VSC's on PWC's, fishing boats, houseboats, paddlecraft, etc. <u>MUST</u> be aware of the new changes in effect after 1 June 2019. Please go to the D11NR Vessel Examiner (VE) website: http://rbsafety.d11nuscgaux.info/ve/ve.html and review ML-1 thru ML-4 and closely review and follow the instructions as ALL of these forms have been revised and approved by DCO Kirkwood.
