DETAILS

1. OPTREX Calendar

It is not too early to schedule your 2024 OPTREX – get the dates on the District Calendar! Scheduled dates are reflected below:

- 2. From COMO Michelle Thornton, Division Chief Surface Operations (DVC-RS): Passing along the answers to questions that have come up a couple of times:
 - There are NO LONGER required hours for initial boat crew qualification. This was part of the Qualification Handbook changes.
 - There are still minimum hours required as a certified boat crew to become eligible for COXN QE.

- There are annual currency maintenance hours that apply but not hours for initial crewmember qualification.
- 3. <u>Initial qualification information</u>: Per ALAUX 003/23, Auxiliary members that have started the qualification process prior to the release last March of this ALAUX, as either a crewmember, coxswain, or PWC operator, are authorized to transfer applicable "TASKs" from the prior Qualification Handbook and continue the qualification process using the new Auxiliary Boat Crew Qualification Handbook, ABQH 16794.52B.
- 4. The following was emailed to all DCDRs and SO-OPs on 29 September:
 Our OTO, BOSN Perez, is planning ahead for funds to be allocated from next year's (2024) budget for OPTREXs and coverage by QEs. To that end, he will need at least a preliminary schedule of OPTREXs sooner rather than later. We have roughed out a very preliminary 2024 calendar based on the last three years' Division OPTREX dates ... a copy is attached. This is a very tentative offering with only Divisions 6 & 11 events locked in on the District calendar. The assigned dates on the schedule are based on prior years and the lower portion of the document lays out that history. Of course, all dates are adjustable as are the venues ... this merely gets something started 'on paper' for planning purposes. DCDRs and SO-OPs, please start thinking about your OPTREX dates now, although there will be some turnover of officers now that the election season is upon us, please get the ball rolling.

Once a Division's OPTREX date is selected, please reserve the date on the District calendar by running it first by our CQEC Angelo Perata and, predicated on his OK, the request should be routed to DCOS Jim Losi so that the event may be added to the calendar. No two OPTREXs will be scheduled for the same weekend simply because there may be a sizeable number of candidates and multiple QEs may be already committed. A reminder ... the schedule is "preliminary" and both the date and venue may be changed as long as it does not conflict with another planned event. No OPTREXs will be scheduled after 08 September 2024.

If a Division's OPTREX date has not been selected by the end of February 2024, a date will be assigned by the OTO, CQEC, and DSO-OP. Again ... this is for planning purposes for funds allocation and QE assignments. The assigned date and venue may be altered if it doesn't work for the Division but in no event, as stated above, will it be booked on a date that is already assigned.

In addition to the "Weekend" dates and "Probable Location", the attached form also includes columns as follows: "# of Candidates due in '24", "Additional Candidates Anticipated", and "# of QEs". Please provide the following information for each of the columns:

- "# of Candidates due in '24" the number in the column is the total requalifications due in 2024 based on AUXDATA II as of 11 September. Please take a close look and let us know of anyone on the 2024 list who will be dropping out of the boat crew program.
- · "Additional Candidates Anticipated" please indicate the number of expected initial qualification candidates. "# of QEs" please leave blank.

Should a boat crew member decide not to attempt requalification and leave the surface operation program, please let me know so that we can maintain an accurate record. Also, please endeavor to collect any PPE in their possession and return it to DIRAUX.

- 5. "Night Certification" QE Check-Rides (repeated from August DSO-OP Report)
 Per the following excerpt from the **Auxiliary Qualification Handbook (AQH)** for Crew:
 - For candidates wanting to be "Night Certified" Performance Criteria #7, #8, and #15 must be part of the check-ride conducted at night. (Reference 1)
 - From the **Auxiliary Qualification Handbook** (**AQH**) for Coxswain:

 For candidates wanting to be "Night Certified" Performance Criteria #7 and #15

 must be part of the check-ride conducted at night (Reference 2)

Thus "Night Certified" is an option on an initial check ride depending on whether or not the candidate wants to be night certified.

Regarding "Recertification", in checking the **Auxiliary Training Handbook (ATH)**, there is no requirement for a night check-ride for recertification on a third-year QE check-ride (Reference 3). If the recertification candidate has completed the prior year's Annual Task Tracker (Reference 4) with the optional night exercises signed off, that would certify them for night certification upon successful completion of a "day" check-ride. If the Annual Task Tracker sign-offs did not include the night exercises, then the candidate would be recertified for "day" operations only.

Important: It is necessary for OPTREX organizers to be notified well in advance if an initial qualification candidate(s) "wants" to be night certified so proper arrangements may be made by the QE(s).

Additionally, a current PPE annual certification will be required for all candidates and it must be entered in ADII.

6. An updated CHECK RIDES DUE DATES Report is posted on the District webpage ... go to "Response", then "Surface Operations". Currently due for requalifying are 13 members in 2023 (7 are in REYR/REWK status), 51 members due in 2024, 62 members due in 2025, and 15 members due in 2026 (requalified this year) for a total of 141 members. Please keep in

mind that certification expires at the end of the year and not on the anniversary date of the last qualification/requalification check ride.
