





PAC AREA Statistics



The NEW D11NR VSC goal for 2024 is 4,000 VSC's. Currently we are 90% of 2023 and have 51% of the PAC AREA VSC total. The data source is AUXDATA2*. Additional stats from AUXDATA2* indicates that 32 or 43% have passed the VSC, 5 or 6% are First Time VSC's, and 22 or 29% are High Focus VSC's. In addition 5 Paddlecraft VSC's have been performed, which is approximately 6% of our total VSC production. We currently have 110 ACTIVE Vessel Examiners (VE's) which averages VSC's per examiner. National average is 20 VSC's per examiner, PACARREA 21 VSC's per Examiner.

VSC Questions

- -These are actual questions from VE Exam Version "F" dated 2014. Answers can be found in another location in the report
 - 1. Inflatable Life Jackets (PFDs) are becoming more and more popular. You are examining a 22' stern drive vessel with two adults and two preteen children aboard. They proudly show you their four new inflatable PFDs, which are out of the manufacturer's original packaging. If everything else is okay, can you issue a VSC decal?
 - a. No. Inflatable Life Jackets (PFDs) are not yet Coast Guard Approved so they don't count as acceptable for carriage.
 - b. Yes, Inflatable life jackets are acceptable for anyone on board.
 - c. No, inflatable Life Jackets (PFDs) are not approved for children under 16 years of age.
 - d. Yes, but you need to examine the firing device by removing the CO2 cartridge to determine it has not been used.
 - 2. On ANSC 7003, if the boat is not trailerable, do all owners have to Initial?
 - a. Yes
 - b. No
 - c. No, only one owner
 - d. Initials are not required

- -VSC's ON RENTALS-At the request of Commodore Kirkwood, and after 18-years, the VSC Rental Program was updated in 2019 and moving forward.

 <u>ANYONE</u> who performs rental VSC's on PWC's, fishing boats, houseboats, paddlecraft, etc. <u>MUST</u> be aware of the new changes in effect after 1 June 2019. Please go to the D11NR Vessel Examiner (VE) website:

 http://rbsafety.d11nuscgaux.info/ve/ve.html and review ML-1 thru ML-4 and closely review and follow the instructions as ALL of these forms have been revised and approved by DCO Kirkwood. - -PLEASE do NOT wear boots to climb aboard a vessel to perform a VSC. Our program allows for deck shoes, white or black tennis/walking with soft soles. If this is not an option, please consider purchasing disposal shoe/boot covers available in the paint or hardware dept. at Wal-Mart, Lowes, Home Depot, etc. a package of 10 for about \$12.

WNational News

NEW-The anticipated and MANDATORY VE workshop is now available and REQUIRED for all certified Vessel Examiners, including those currently training to become Vessel Examinners, and members in REYR status who intend to regain their certification. The workshop has new information regarding the VSC vs. UPV, the MMSI, EPIRB, and PLB, but is mostly a review of fire extinguishers, uniforms, etc. Also, please be certain to review Appendix B before closing the workshop.

As in the past, members who individually complete the VE Workshop must submit the

Workshop Attestation Form to their Flotilla Staff Office for Information Services (FSO-IS) for entry into AUXDATA2. As in the past, the workshop MUST be completed prior to June 30, or you will be in REWK and none of your VSC activity can be entered into AUXDATA 2.
