US COAST GUARD AUXILIARY DISTRICT 11NR BOARD AND STAFF MEETING MINUTES 10 September 2011

The meeting was called to order by DCO Angelo Perata at 0930, who introduced Howard Gladwin, Auxiliarist from District 9C and CDR Curtis Sumrok, DIRAUX, who gave a few words.

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by COMO Mike Williams, IPDCO and the Guardian Ethos was led by Rod Collins, DCOS. Following the Ethos, DCO Perata called for a moment of silence in remembrance of the 10th Anniversary of the 9/11 terrorist attack.

Joyce Bell, DSO-SR called the roll, and DCO Perara declared that a quorum was present. The attendance list is attached to these minutes as Attachment A.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

DCO Perata called for approval of the 18 June 2011 minutes.

<u>Motion</u>: Nick Tarlson, DCDR-12 moved and Brian O'Mara, VCDR-4 seconded that the minutes be approved as distributed. There being no discussion, the motion was adopted.

DCO Perata called for approval of the 17 August 2011 minutes.

<u>Motion</u>: Nick Tarlson, DCDR-12 moved and Simone Adair, DCDR-1 seconded that the minutes be approved as distributed. There being no discussion, the motion was adopted.

DCO REPORT

DCO Perata reported on the following items:

- The new Auxiliary Manual is on line and available to download.
- Members are encouraged to submit Form 7029 on line. The procedure is easy, and COMO
 Marilyn McBain, DSO-IS will give a presentation on how it's done. The reporting of these hours
 is very important in order to provide justification for funding Auxiliary projects and activities.
- Thanks to CAPT Maguire and CDR Sumrok the Coast Guard is offering Auxiliarists "A Day on the Bay" on board the *Aspen* on 16 October. The cruise will accommodate 150 people, and the first 150 individuals registered will be allowed to attend. Registration is open to Auxiliary members and immediate family (don't know about children). Uniform is civilian casual, and lunch will be served for a nominal fee. Registration will be through the office of Rich Thomas, DCAPT, 707-987-2227 (M-F) 9am to 5pm. Information will be posted on the district web site under "What's New."
- District membership at the beginning of 2011 was 1496. We are currently at 1553 members.
- The State of California is no longer giving away brochures, whistles, etc., but they will give away safety equipment, including life jackets.

- DCO Perata, assisted by CDR Sumrok, presented the VSC Award 1st Place Award to D11N, Flotilla 10-2. Mike Lauro, DSO-VE accepted the award.
- DCO Perata, assisted by CDR Sumrok, presented the NOAA Charting Award and the Charting Update Award to D11N. Jim Duncan, DSO-NS accepted the award.
- DCO Perata, assisted by CDR Sumrok, presented a Charting Update Award to Kevin Sellstrom.

DISTRICT BOARD REPORTS

DCO Perata called for district board reports as follows:

<u>Simone Adair, DCDR-1</u> – Report on file (Attachment B). Several facilities in the division participated in SAR cases this past month. Fleet Week shoreside planning continues, with 100 volunteers. We would still like more volunteers. Auxiliarist George Barantseff provided interpretation assistance for the Russian training ship *Pallada*. Two division members are attending planning meetings for the *Stratton* commissioning.

Ed Kief, DCDR-3 — Report on file (Attachment B). The division meeting was held on 9 September and the Everbridge test was discussed. Members expressed that because of high summer temperatures, they would like to be able to continue to wear the hot weather uniform for patrols. The 2011 Division COW is 10 December at 1200. The 2012 COW will be 8 December.

<u>Brian O'Mara, VCDR-4</u>, Report on file (Attachment B). The division will be supporting the VA Hospital on 11 November. They are also looking at supporting the Veterans' Day parade in San Jose. The division is planning an OPTREX in Redwood City.

<u>Curtis Han, DCDR-5</u> – Report on file (Attachment B). The division has sponsored several PE classes in August, including paddleboat courses. They had 115 students and 12 adults in a PE class at the YMCA. They have an increased presence on waterways with their AWW work. This has been very successful. Division elections are 6 October. The Division COW is also 10 December.

<u>Judy Esteban, P-PCA</u> – Report on file (Attachment B). The PCA fair had 200 members present. Thanks to AuxChef for providing the luncheon. Flotilla 04-09 received the award and check for most attendees at the PCA Fair. The Memorial patio is completed. Thanks to everyone who worked on the construction of it. Thanks to Roger Haynes for chairing the memorial construction. So far, 43 Auxiliary members and friends have participated. PCA elections will be in November.

<u>COMO Mike Williams, IPDCO</u> – The boating season is drawing to an end, and this is a good to check the tires on your boat trailer. They wear out from sun and salt rot. Also be sure to check your inflatable life jackets.

<u>CDR Curtis Sumrok, DIRAUX</u> – The POMS issue got a lot of attention at NACON. On the local level, CDR Sumrok expressed appreciation to Gail Ramsey and Anita Farnholtz for their work on POMS.

<u>CWO Danny Kilburger, OTO</u> – At the PCA Fair CWO Kilburger gave a presentation on QE preparation. He has designed the presentation to help Crew/Coxswains prepare for QE signoff. SAMA expenditures this year will not be the basis for next year's funding, because of the POMS problems. This will happen next year instead. Kilburger introduced Tina Perry, DIRAUX Office Manager, who presented the following information:

<u>Auxiliary Memorial</u> – DCO Perata announced that there will be a ribbon-cutting ceremony for the Auxiliary memorial on 19 November during the district board and staff meeting. More details will be forthcoming.

<u>Sue Fry, DSO-MS</u> – Report on file (Attachment C). A good effort is being made in the AWW program. Ferry boat audit presence this weekend is being coordinated by Abigail Wagg.

<u>Jim Duncan, DSO-NS</u> – Report on file (Attachment C). 30 September is the deadline for all PATON work to be completed. Several still need to be done. Only 35% of the aid verifiers have submitted the 7030 for their activity. Duncan emphasized the importance of submitting time to continue funding.

An Auxiliary helo on patrol today spotted a capsized boat with 4 PIW. The sighting was reported, and the helo directed the rescue vessel to pick up the victims. One of the victims appeared to be in serious condition. The sighting probably saved his life.

<u>Jeff Price, DSO-CM</u> – Report on file (Attachment C). Price will be working on Sector events at Monterey.

<u>COMO Gail Ramsey, DSO-OP</u> – Report on file (Attachment C). Happiness is POMS working. We are still losing some facilities. There may be some changes district-wise to see what we can do. Next month there will be some stats.

<u>Dean LaChapelle, DCAPT-RES</u> – Report on file (Attachment B). NACON introduced SABOT (Standardized Auxiliary Boat Operations Training) program. We may extract some of the items used. When we do MOB training, most are done with Type IV's or fenders. They don't represent reality. We need to use something that looks more human-like so we have an opportunity to see how difficult a PIW is to locate. Using a weighted dummy allows planning on how to bring the person on board the boat. We are still working on whether or not to hold another District OPEX next year. We had great turnout for the 2011 OPEX. Dockside and comms training were great.

Rich Thomas, DCAPT-SUP called for the following staff reports:

<u>Jimmin Chang, DSO-CS</u> – Report on file (Attachment C). The election results have been entered on the district web site. Elected officers are responsible for use of the email distribution list. Some divisions are not using it, some are overusing it. Be sure you use the list appropriately and send only essential information. Make sure it's appropriate, secure and accurate.

Bob Davison, DSO-HR – Excused. Report on file (Attachment C).

<u>COMO Marilyn McBain, DSO-IS</u> – Report on file (Attachment C). COMO McBain will be gone from 30 September to 20 October and will not be available via phone or email.

DETAILS

- The Everbridge test 31 August, 2011 brought up a good list of issues with the system. Two of the five FC's were out of town, therefore didn't receive the emergency message. One of the five FC's was at the hospital getting a chemo treatment, therefore didn't receive the message. The other two FC's received the message and immediately responded by sending an emergency message to their respective Flotilla's. The conclusion from the Division 3 Board is that their needs to be a back-up of some sort. Perhaps after 15 minutes and no response from a FC the call would go the VFC or back to the DCDR who could send the message to the flotilla members.
- The feedback I got from the FC's was that some members didn't wait for the whole message and push the number one telling the system that the call was acknowledged.
- ALCOAST 291/11 has the Div. 3 Operations members talking about mutiny. The average
 age of operations member on D-3 is around 68 and their old body's aren't as resilient to the
 heat as younger people. In the Sacramento, Redding are the ambient heat from May to
 October runs from 95 to 112 and the time frame SAR patrols are most needed on the inland
 waters is from 1300 to 2000. That time frame being the hottest part of the day and heat
 exhaustion becomes a magnanimous threat and the GAR will end the patrol before it starts.
- Way back in March or April I (I haven't checked the minutes for a correct date) I reported the COW would be 10 December, 1200 hours, at the Dante Club, 2330 Fair Oaks Blvd, Sacramento, UOD trops. The District Calendar shows otherwise.

According to DSO-NS, we have completed all 9 of our bridge verifications and 137 out of 173 (the largest number assigned to any division) or 79 percent of our PATONs. SO-NS Linda Haynes is planning on completing the remaining PATONs later this month.
- We will be offering the Introduction to Public Affairs course, AUX-20, on Saturday, October 15, at 0900 in classroom 35, Coast Guard Island. This is a great way to get started in the Public Affairs training program, which is geared to qualification as a Public Affairs Specialist. Members from throughout the District are welcome to participate. Contact SO-PA Perry Joiner for more information.
- Several of our members will be participating in an unusually aggressive Ferry Vessel Audit program this weekend, in commemoration of the 10th anniversary of the 911 terrorist attack.
- Sonia Foster will be offering a Dockwalker activity on Saturday, September 17.

Response

- Melody worked with the new 45' Response Boat Medium (RBM), CG 45667, this past weekend, serving as the target boat for several towing evolutions.
- Two of our flotillas broadcast the AIMS test message timely in our recent test. One flotilla sent the message out a day or so later. I am still working with one flotilla. My recommendations based on the test are to establish additional backup systems.
- It would be extremely useful to have the Vice Commanders accessing and working with the system in parallel with the Commanders. Any individual can be tied up for a few hours or even a couple of days, and this would provide us with more depth in the response effort.
- I am also concerned about our ability to work fluidly through the flotilla commanders in the initial broadcast. I agree that the FCs should be able to use the system, particularly to follow up on local tasking. But I believe we would have a much better response if the initial broadcast went out to the entire membership, with a note to anticipate tactical follow up at the division and flotilla level.
- Finally, the email message is particularly confusing. It directs the recipient to click on a link to confirm receipt. The message content follows the link. If the recipient clicks on the link without reading the message, they will very likely miss it completely, which is what I think happened in our cases. This is even more likely to be a problem for those who review email on a smart phone or pda, due to the limited screen size.
- Several of our members are planning to complete their boat crew certifications at the Division 4
 OPEX on 24 September.
- Our members are gearing up for Fleet Week. We have openings on *Journey* for all four days, for
 those who would like to join us. We have had some success using the doodle.com scheduling
 system to manage our crew assignments and staffing for this vessel. You or your members can

OSCS Samp (Sector San Francisco Command Center Supervisor) came out to see the comms team in action and was very impressed with what we had to offer and reiterated the need for the Auxiliary Trailer in areas like the Delta and beyond. During one of these meetings, a communications committee was formed and the Auxiliary Communications will most certainly play a huge part of the event. The planning has begun but nothing has been ironed out. COMO Connell will provide all the normal details. The need for qualified and detail oriented communicators will be sought when the time comes.

NEW AUXILIARY REPEATER

The newest repeater is still taking shape. Discussions about power have come into focus so the Auxiliary team will be looking to go green! I have been investigating a solar power source on the SF Peninsula and the talks have begun. I will be working with the EO at the Sector as he needs to sign off on this project and a trip to the top of Mt. Umunhum will be coming shortly. The items needed to put the repeater into service are just about in place. I have also contacted a local County Communications Manager and inquired if the Auxiliary can use some free space in their very well maintained shack. There is also a possibility of adding another one on a north bay mountain top that will cover areas like Petaluma, Sonoma and east through the Carquinez straits. The MT. Umunhum repeater is the first priority and the others will come with reports down the line.

POMS information for Land Mobiles

Recently we have experienced an outage with POMS. At this time the PAC for the Mobiles (Me) is unable to log in from home, but can log in at the WS3 at the Sector. I will make sure that all orders are processed by the Wednesday before the patrol is activated. The following information is being sent out again in hopes that everyone requesting orders will know exactly what to do. I am ALWAYS available by phone for those who have questions no matter what Division the member is in. When placing orders in POMS, please make sure that you have listed ALL LAND MOBILE PATROLS. This is important for recording the numbers for District awards and recognition. Also, during a mobile patrol the only thing that can be reimbursed is mileage not things like ICE or FUEL. Please note that ANY 5132's that are turned in that have things other than mileage will be returned to the member thus making your reimbursement take a little longer.

There will be no more same day patrols. I have been getting emails from communicators that they have had a last minute change in their plans and would like to be activated. It is the responsibility of the member to make sure that his or her calendar is in order. The surface assets require a week's advance notice. I will not go that far, but I would appreciate having all orders in POMS by the Wednesday prior to the patrol.

SAR CALL OUTS fall into a completely different category and orders for call outs will be entered at the time of the call out.

OPERATIONS RIBBON RECOGNIZED - TCO-PQS

CHDIRAUX has announced that "Effective immediately Section 11.A.14a. of the Auxiliary Manual is amended as follows and will be so included in the next update:

"This ribbon recognizes qualifications in the various operations program areas. Auxiliarists who qualify as an Auxiliary boat or air crew member, air observer, AtoN verifier, Coast Guard watch stander, Coast Guard boat crewman, Coast Guard boat engineer, or Auxiliary interpreter (Level A) may wear the Operations Program ribbon. Watch standers and boat engineers are defined as Auxiliarists who have been designated in writing by a Coast Guard unit, or the Director, as qualified in that position.

Auxiliarists designated by the Director as Auxiliary watch standers according to District requirements may also wear the Operations Program ribbon. Additionally, Auxiliarists holding the Auxiliary Telecommunications Operator (TCO) qualification or who have qualified as AUXCOM prior to August 1, 2008, are authorized to wear the Operations Program ribbon. Auxiliarists show multiple qualifications by adding 3/16-inch bronze or silver stars. The "E" device is authorized to be worn on the Auxiliary Operations Program ribbon by Auxiliarists who are currently appointed, or have been appointed, as a Qualification Examiner (QE) or Flight Examiner (FE). No miniature "E" device for miniature medals is authorized."

ARMS (Auxiliary Resource Management System)

The ARMS program still exists in this District and still remains the only way to be called out for any Sector related mission. Entry into this system is very simple, just be a mobile communicator (passing AUXCOM or TCO-PQS) and be willing to be available 24 hours a day for any type of assistance that is needed. This could range from helping with securing open microphones to other Government agency liaison work. The Delta region has been stood up as well as the long standing Bay Area. Please contact the DSO-CM to be involved. We currently have 65 members listed in the system. This system also has the ability to text and send out real time emergency information.

CONTINUED REQUESTS FOR AUX COMMUNICATIONS

Sector San Francisco has put the Auxiliary Comms Unit in the monthly rotation for the Rescue 21 update. Each month the Sector requests to use the AUX repeater to help them while updates to the R21 system get made. This requires that the repeater be placed on full remote base transmit. We are fully committed to this and will continue to provide that service at no cost.

August results for the District Store have been relatively good. We ended up with \$6,154.11 in Total Income with \$1,837.81 in Gross Profit. Sales at the recent PCA Fair were in line with previous PCAs and this year's DTRAIN with \$4,925.51 and about 400 items sold. In comparison the February PCA brought \$4,838.22 in sales with 409 items sold while at DTRAIN we had \$4,120.22 in sales and 406 items sold.

Year-to-date we have \$21, 327.32 in sales with a Gross Profit of just over \$8,000.

There are new uniform changes blowing in the wind but nothing that affects us at this point. Most of the changes you are hearing about are for Active Duty and are not required of the Auxiliary at this time.

Vessel Schedules were sent to all Auditors and all Ferry Vessels will have Auxiliary Auditors on them for those two days, including late afternoon and early evening runs. UNINSPECTED PASSENGER VESSELS

We have a new ADSO for UPV's, Dale Fajardo, a member of Flotilla 15 and a newly qualified CFVS examiner. He is presently completing his UPV PQS.. He is near both Half Moon Bay and the Hyde St/Fisherman Wharf areas and is situated well to make contacts with UPV owner/operators in two of our prime areas. Be looking for development of improving contacts with OUPV's. Our thanks go to Rick Saber who gave the UPV program his attention for the past year and a half. There is interest in the Tahoe area for training. The Coast Guard is assessing the need for examiners and to locate UPV owner/operators to be included in an educational program. We may be asking for help from the VE's on their rounds of Marina's in the Delta areas.

COMMERCIAL FISHING VESSEL

A training will be held in the fall for the Crab Season. Trainings are held by the Coast Guard coordinator and are usually held on Wednesdays at CGI. Contact Skip Morford, ADSO or Sue Fry, DSO for information. The training date will be 2 Nov and the CFV dockside exams at 5 locations on 7,8,9 Nov 2011.

PREVENTION EDUCATION AND TRAINING

ADSO Simone Adair reports that the new presentation Waterways Management went well at the PCA Training Fair as did the Prevention Outreach Specialist PQS training. Teaching the courses were Simone Adair, Sue Fry and Dale Fajardo. The new course WWM is appropriate for all members, those in Operations as well as Prevention. The material covers many of the Coast Guard Departments/Branches and gives an overview of what they do and how they work together. It is recommended for members who have been in the Auxiliary for a year or are familiar with the Coast Guard Missions.

Wil Sumner is a Coast Guard qualified Hazwoper trainer having completed the course at Petaluma. He now joins Jerry Bynum, and Frank Shelly in being able to give the 4 and 8 hour course and has been assisting Jerry at the PCA and DTRAINS.

Additional training in the ICS series, Pollution Responder and other courses are usually available when presented for Active Duty. Please contact Sue Fry for availability or a POC contact.

REGIONAL EXAM CENTER

There is no longer a Coast Guard presence at the REC. so the Auxiliary is of great help to them. The Auxiliary is being used to grade pilot exams and charting sets. Also Auxiliarists were used in preparing a proposal for a new R-OUPV exam. This is a test for OUPV's operating on Rivers and streams, usually as river and fishing guides.

AGENCY CONTACTS

The DSO-Prevention will participate on a Panel at the Small Vessel Security Conference to be held at the Marines Memorial Auditorium in San Francisco in late September. The Auxiliary emphasis is on the AWW program and how the Auxiliary increases awareness to the boating community through the various Auxiliary programs.

1. IMPORTANCE OF THE ANSC 7030: Have you submitted your ANSC 7030 form to your FSO-IS officer for your ATON, Bridge and Chart Updating activity? Why not! To date only 35% of Aid Verifier Activities has been submitted into AUXDATA. If you are not submitting your 7030's, you are short changing yourself, your Flotilla, your Division, District Auxiliary members and our Auxiliary programs. You have not completed your Aid Verifying activity if you have not given your 7030 to your FSO-IS Officer.

The 7030 reports provide one of the bases for AUXDATA. This report serves three major functions:

- a. The 7030 cumulative data forms the statistical basis for justification to the United States Congress of expenditures of public monies to support Team Coast Guard. This is funds that we use for Auxiliary activity. By not submitting your 7030 you're hurting our bottom line.
- b. Accurate and timely activity reporting to ensure adequate and prompt recognition of accomplishments at both the individual and unit levels. The "Sustains Auxiliary Service Award" for each 750 hours of activity is just one of many awards that are based on AUXDATA information.
- c. Areas requiring attention and/or correction are revealed promptly, making timely action feasible. We cannot improve our Auxiliary programs without this important information.
- **2. QUALITY STATEMENT FOR ALL ATON & CHART UPDATING REPORTS:** The Navigation Systems Division's goals of **accuracy, credibility, professionalism** and **service to the Coast Guard and NOAA-NOS**, it is necessary to revisit the ways that, as Auxiliarists, we submit information to all branches of the Coast Guard and other agencies such as NOAA-NOS. So much information, in the past, was unusable that a negative image of the Auxiliary was created. Adhere to the following suggestions and you can be assured that your data will be of high quality.

Many members & Aid Verifiers are using the statement below in the Comments section of NS-AN04 [7054 Aid to Navigation Report] and the NS-CU03 [Chart Updating Report 77-5a] for their ATON, Non-Permitted PATON & Chart Updating Reports as a statement of the quality of their submission. Much of the data is static, reflecting the pre-underway check status--the model and manufacturer's name of equipment. The rest of the data is collected on scene.

Use the below statement in the Comments section of your ATON/CU Reports as a reference of the quality of your submission. The yellow data is static, reflecting the pre-underway equipment check status--the model and manufacturer's name and setting etc. The green data is collected on scene. Keep this statement in your computer and simply copy and paste it on each report and update the necessary fields.

- **4.** MISSING MARINAS ON SMALL CRAFT FACILITY CHARTS: Are you noticing a lot of marinas missing from your Small Craft Facility Chart 18652, 18661 & 18662? When you get any of the three new charts all Auxiliary Operational and Recreational vessels should look them over very closely! You will be very surprised. Chart 18652 lost 64 marina locations, Chart 18661 has lost 62 marina locations and Chart 18662 has lost 18 marina locations for a total of 144 marinas not on you charts. This is why our three D11 small craft facility charts [covering all of San Francisco Bay to Antioch and the Sacramento and San Joaquin River Delta] are missing these marinas.
- 5. <u>First Repeater AUXILIARY AID TO NAVIGATION VERIFIER PERFORMANCE QUALIFICATION STANDARD (PQS)</u>: At long last, the Aids Verifier Performance Qualification Standard (AV PQS) is now out in the field. Captain Andy Rizzo Chief Director of Auxiliary, recently signed the ATON Verifier PQS provides the minimum knowledge base required and must be completed for Coast Guard Auxiliarists to qualify for <u>new</u> applicants for Auxiliary ATON Verifier status only; however, I highly recommended that all currently certified Aid Verifiers at least work through the PQS to familiarize you with its tasks because you will be the <u>Verifying Officer</u>. This qualification is the baseline national standard for qualification as an Aid Verifier. The ATON Verifier PQS, training guides, power points and other important AV-PQS information is located on the National Prevention Department website at http://pdept.cgaux.org/nsAidVerifier.html. 


